Who we are and what we do

Gugan Gulwan Youth Aboriginal Corporation was created to support young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in the ACT and surrounding regions to thrive and succeed. Our commitment is to protect, nurture and support children, youth and their families as they grow – from birth, through childhood, adolescence and into adulthood.

The mandate of Gugan Gulwan is twofold. The first is to work with, and through, our many partners to establish a system of services and supports that strengthen families and help those of our children and youth who are experiencing vulnerability. The second is to lead advocacy and effective policy development on issues that affect all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and youth.

Since its creation, Gugan Gulwan has built considerable expertise in the area of child and youth development. This focus on positive development informs our role as a champion and catalyst for the outcomes of all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and youth in our region.

Gugan Gulwan actively shares our expertise with others and works in partnership to create opportunities for the voices of children and youth to be heard across the sector and within government. Successfully carrying out these roles requires a workforce with a broad range of skills, including: case management; community engagement; counselling, direct service delivery; policy development; program design; systems design; program evaluation and oversight; partnership development; financial and capital management; human resources; information technology; information management and analytics; organisational development; and administration. While not always visible, each of these functions is crucial for serving our region's young people effectively and responsibly.

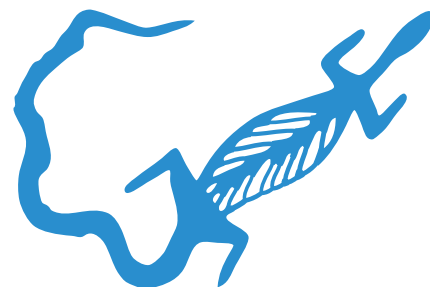

It is a testament to the strength, passion, tenacity and commitment to our Board of Directors, Executive Director, Deputy Director, and staff that Gugan Gulwan has met and continues to meet the unprecedented challenges the health pandemic and associated impacts on our First Nation's community.

Gugan Gulwan has continued to meet the increased demand for services and support as the health emergency continues to unfold locally and nationally. We have worked within the consortium of organisations making up the Canberra Relief Network to be an access and distribution point for essential items.

Gugan Gulwan established a COVID-19 Community Assistance Program in response to community need that included the provision of food, cleaning products, internet and communications devices and skip bins for waste removal.

Gugan Gulwan has been strong in advocating to the ACT Education Directorate regarding the re-engagement of our First Nation's young people in their education including identifying strategies and pathways that will support our young people.

A vital and critical component of any qualitative organisation is the ability to effectively plan, develop and respond to community (and funding requirements) that support the delivery of current programs and forecast future needs. This has never been more relevant with the ongoing health pandemic and being able to effectively adapt and deliver services that meet community need.

Gugan Gulwan, recognises we need to consolidate and filter external demands for service by looking at our capacity, demand and or value add to the organisation and wider community. We cannot be a service to all people and or agencies for all things.

The last 12 months has demonstrated the resilience and strength of our organisation and showcased our ability to adapt to change: when the changes were largely unknown.

Gugan Gulwan Youth Aboriginal Corporation is creative, innovative, and unique organisation that recognises and remains accountable to our greatest stakeholder **our community.**

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Young Men's Mentoring Group



Gugan Gulwan's Young Men's Mentoring Group (YMMG) is a highly sought-after program, with an extensive waiting list, for young men aged between 8-12 years. There were **30 sessions** delivered.

The Young Men's Mentoring Group has an Early Intervention approach to Young Men's Mental Health. A significant number of the young men that participate in the program are disconnected from family, culture, and community. As a result, they often suffer with a loss of identity. The ongoing impacts of transgenerational trauma cannot be underrated and are often witnessed in this group as "challenging" behaviours. Strategies and ways of managing strong emotions are taught and role modelled by program staff and mentors in culturally safe and appropriate ways.

An invaluable part of the program is having young men as they transitioned out of the target age range to return to the YMMG program as a mentor for the current young men participating. The mentors role model and demonstrate healthy relationships and communication. The mentors provide their own unique insight and experience as to how the program supported and benefitted them.

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Group Programs

Gugan Gulwan School Holiday Program

The Gugan Gulwan school holiday program continues to be a in demand program for young people and their families. The program continues to focus on providing activities and support to young people that deliver learning, culture knowledge and practice, social and emotional wellbeing, healthy relationships and, of course, recreation in two fun filled weeks each holiday period.

96 young people participated in the program.

A unique component to our school holiday program is the opportunity provided for young people aged 16 years and over to participate in the delivery of the school holiday program as an assistant/mentor on the program. The young people on the program have scheduled hours, program responsibilities, supervision and engagement of young people and need to provide evidence of WWVP status. All program assistants are a highly valued resource. Being an assistant on the program supports young adults develop and manage responsibilities whilst providing tangible work experience.

Gugan Gulwan Tutoring Program

The Gugan Gulwan is an individualised program of support for young First Nations students that supports their ongoing engagement in school, individual learning and builds self-confidence in the student's learning journey. All students on the program receive 10 x 1-hour sessions facilitated by Canberra Tutoring.

55 young people accessed this program in the 12-month period.

Gugan Gulwan Drop In Music Program

The Gugan Gulwan Music program is designed to engage and support First Nations young people in the ACT region who have an interest or passion for music. The music program is for young people at elemental or intermediate levels. The program provides a range of musical instruments with ongoing music tuition and performance opportunities.

The Gugan Gulwan Music program has attracted a range of musicians/tutors wanting to support the young people accessing this program including but not limited to Program Coordinator Dale Huddleston, Stewart Barton, ANU School of Music, and other community members who provide mentoring and specific instrument tuition. The Gugan Gulwan Music Program regularly perform at community and school-based events across the ACT region.

The demand for the Music program has grown over this reporting period and we have expanded instrument tuition to include piano and ukulele with additional tutor's from ANU School of Music supporting the increased demand.

32 music sessions have been delivered.

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Gugan Gulwan Parenting Our Way Program



The Gugan Gulwan Parenting Our Way program is delivered to parent/carers of First Nations children within the community.

The program provides opportunities for families to engage in the learning and development of life skills, group activities and educational information sessions with themed sessions delivered by subject matter experts. Participants in this program receive practical parental support, advice and information on issues affecting them. The program is delivered in an environment that is safe, free from judgement and culturally sensitive.

Themed sessions facilitated included:

- COVID-19 information and resources -addressing social and emotional wellbeing, and community needs
- “How to” Home Maintenance sessions - covering wall repairs, painting, changing locks, and flyscreen repairs with Programmed ACT
- 50 Father’s Day Gift Packs - delivered to men in the community as a special way of recognising their contribution and strengths to their families and wider community. The Father’s Day gift packs were warmly received and were an unanticipated but welcome surprise for many.
- Legal Aid ACT presented on Family Law matters, housing/maintenance issues/disputes as well as employment, and discrimination.
- The ‘Future Friendly Team’ (who are working with the ACT Government) to identify ways to reduce the barriers people face accessing government services. The key services raised were:
 - Working with Vulnerable People (WWVP) registrations and (in future)
 - National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) worker screening requirements
 - Driver’s licence
 - Concessions
- Jeff Morgan -Health and Wellbeing, Consultant, Nutritionist and Mentor delivered community workshops covering nutrition, exercise, lunch box ideas in collaboration with Gugan Gulwan and Tuggeranong Child and Family Centre to the Koori Preschools across the ACT
- ACT Fire and Rescue and Programmed ACT community workshop to address and provide information on fire safety awareness in the home including the safe use of appliances, heater, dryers and checking of smoke detectors.

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Functional Family Therapy-Child Welfare (FFT-CW)

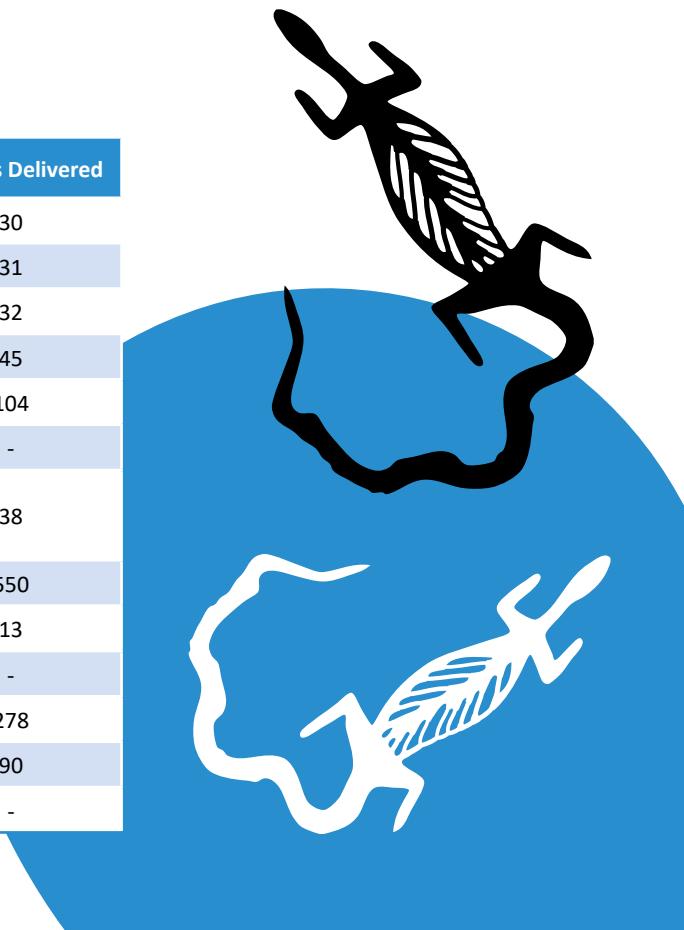
- The Functional Family Therapy-Child Welfare (FFT-CW) program partnership between Gudan Gulwan and OzChild continues to build and expand. The FFT-CW program commenced in November 2018 and works with the whole family unit to address and reduce risks associated with children being removed into the out of home care system.
- Gudan Gulwan invests a significant amount of time preparing families for FFT-CW before the referral is sent to the team for intake. This includes (but isn't limited to) engaging families and promoting the program and OzChild.
- On average families work within the program for 4-9 months. From 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2021, 49 families were referred to FFT_CW intake.

Therapeutic Counselling Outreach Program -Relationships Australia

Gudan Gulwan in partnership with Relationships Australia Dhulung Yarra Program provide male and female counselling services to young people that addresses and recognises young men and women's challenges or concerns in an environment that is culturally safe.

22 young people were engaged in counselling over the 12-month period, with 132 individual counselling sessions completed.

First Nations Children's Day 2020

Gugan Gulwan celebrated National First Nations Children's Day on 4th August by coordinating celebratory visits throughout the week to the Koori preschools across the ACT to join in on this important day.

All the young children at the Koori Preschools across the ACT received a SNAICC First Nations Children's Day bag containing cardboard animals, Indigenous seeds, activity sheets, crayons and a book donated by the Indigenous Literacy Foundation.

Gugan Gulwan delivered special cupcakes to all the children and enjoyed sharing culture and yarns with our young people.

Gugan Gulwan R U OK Day

Gugan Gulwan acknowledged R U OK Day on the 10 September by hosting a community R U OK BBQ. Gugan Gulwan recognises that 2020 has brought unprecedented challenges to all of us, but a significant impact has been people's ongoing mental health and wellbeing.

Gugan Gulwan wanted to provide the community an opportunity to come and sit have a conversation in an environment that was culturally safe, supported and non-judgemental.

Gugan Gulwan provided mental health resources to community members and followed upon what to say after asking R U Ok? The R U OK BBQ was well received with over 70 community members in attendance including students from Erindale College and CIT.

Gugan Gulwan Youth Week Event 2021

On Thursday 1st of April 2021, Gugan Gulwan delivered a Youth Week event for our First Nation's young people, and wider community members.

The event was well attended and included a variety of activities, and competitions including a jumping castle, face painting, Cultural Questionnaire for young people (with prizes), Easter Egg Jar guessing competition, movie tickets, 3 on 3 basketball competition.

Winnunga Nimmitjiah AMS, and the AFP Aboriginal Liaison Officer attended the event as stall holders and promoted programs and service to the community.

The special guests of the day were some of the Brumbies players attending and participating in the 3 on 3 basketball competition with the young people. The basketball competition was action packed and hotly contested by the participating teams and was exciting to watch.

A community BBQ lunch was provided with over 60 community members in attendance.

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Young Women's Mentoring Group



31 sessions were delivered with an average of 10 participants attending each week.

The Gugan Gulwan Young Women's Mentoring Group (YWMG) is for young First Nation's women between the ages of 12-15 years. The program is holistic in design and provides opportunities for the young women to engage in learning life skills, participate in group activities and educational information sessions. A core foundation of the program is cultural knowledge, learning and practice as this helps the young women to grow and instils further understanding and pride in their culture, history, and themselves. The young women in this program develop a deeper understanding of relevant contemporary issues affecting them, the ability to self-advocate and to improve their own personal development/identity in an environment that is safe, free from judgement and culturally sensitive.

A vital part of the program is having past participants return to the program as mentors. The mentors role model and demonstrate healthy relationships and communication. The mentors provide their own unique insight and experience to current participants as to how the program supported and contributed to their own development.

To address and support the young women a tailored program of educational sessions and physical activities was developed in consultation with the young women.

An exciting achievement of the YWMG was being provided the opportunity to be involved with the Boots for a Brighter Future Program through the Cultural Choice Association in collaboration and partnership with the NRL Canberra Raiders. This Boots for a Brighter Future Program raises awareness and support for the prevention of First Nations Youth Suicide and Mental Health. The YWMG designed and painted football boots which were worn by players during the annual NRL Indigenous Round and were later auctioned with a percentage of all proceeds being gifted to the Boots for a Brighter Future program. A special highlight of this opportunity was the YWMG meeting and painting the football boots with some of the Canberra Raiders players.

- Nutrition and Healthy Lifestyle workshops with subject matter expert Jeffrey Morgan,
- Art, Dreamtime and Cultural Artefacts Sessions/Lessons/ Practice,
- Sexual Health Information Sessions-SHPACT,
- Boots for a Brighter Future Program,
- Designing own clothing for the Young Women's Mentoring Group,
- Mother's Day Gifts,
- Living skills-cooking, hygiene, healthy communication, etc

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Case Management

Gugan Gulwan case management services are delivered across three sections within the organisation Child, Youth and Family Support Team, Drug and Alcohol/Mental Health Team and Reconnect Team. Each team works in collaboration to provide overarching case management and support to clients.

The Child, Youth and Family Support Team is made up of a 1 x Early Childhood Worker, 1 x Youth Worker and overarching Family Support Worker.

The Drug and Alcohol and Mental Health Team is made up of 3 x Drug and Alcohol Outreach Workers with one dedicated position to the delivery of programs in AMC, Bimberi, Ted Noffs, Burrunju Art Gallery, Yass and Queanbeyan schools.

The Mental Health team is comprised of a Dual Diagnosis Worker and Social and Emotional Wellbeing Worker that deliver service and case management to client experiencing co-morbid conditions.

The Reconnect team includes two Family Liaison Officers that provide case management and outreach to young people and their families aged between 12-18 years that are at risk of homelessness or disengagement from their education.

163 families were case managed over the 12-month period.

Mental Health

An identified gap in service for our First Nations young people in the ACT and surrounding regions is a culturally appropriate mental health application that allows young people to seek help and information for mental health supports that is culturally safe and considered. Gugan Gulwan in April 2021 contracted a media development company to develop a web and mobile application for this purpose with the aim of launching the application to coincide with our R U Ok day event in September 2021.

Gugan Gulwan in 2021 reviewed and developed new mental health promotional/information resources with the theme “It’s OK to talk about it” including: Posters, Mental Health folding Information Cards, Sherpas/Bandanas, Laptop Covers, Mousepads, and Air Fresheners.

Gugan Gulwan Sports Assistance Program

Sport plays an important role in our communities by promoting social inclusion, cohesion, healthy lifestyles, individual and community wellbeing. Financial affordability is one of the key barriers to participation for First Nation’s young people wishing to join sporting clubs. The Gugan Gulwan Sports Assistance Program commenced in March 2021 and has supported 11 young people in sport participation.

Jeff Amatto - More Cultural Rehabs Less Jail Workshops

Over two days in May 2021 Gugan Gulwan facilitated the delivery of workshops with Jeff Amatto for young people in NSW and ACT.

Jeff Amatto shares his story of addiction, incarceration, recovery, and survival within a cultural and spiritual framework.

The workshops were highly successful and engaged “hard to reach” target audience with over 50 young people attending these workshops.

National Sorry Day Event for Community 26th May 2021

Gugan Gulwan supported the delivery and participated in the National Sorry Day Community event held on the 26 May 2021 at Boomanulla Oval. The event included trauma informed information sessions, men’s and women’s business, cultural practices, and community discussions.

Gugan Gulwan and Winnunga Nimmityjah Christmas present delivery

Gugan Gulwan, in collaboration, with Winnunga Nimmityjah decided due to ongoing restrictions related to the current health pandemic decided in 2020 we would not hold a joint Children's Christmas Party for the community.

However, both organisations were committed to spreading some Christmas cheer and positivity by Santa doing delivering presents across the community for our young people aged 0-16 years.

Over 420 registrations for children's gifts were received and delivered across the ACT, Queanbeyan, Yass, Carwoola and Bungendore. Over the 7-10 December 2020, Gugan Gulwan and Winnunga staff with help from Santa and his elves delivered the presents across ACT and surrounding region.

This was a very much welcomed initiative from the community as many families were experiencing additional hardship and young people and their families were overwhelmed to have their own special time with Santa. This was an extremely rewarding event for staff and community.

Christmas Hampers including fresh fruit and vegetable, meat vouchers along with pantry items were delivered to 70 Case Managed families and elders with a further 20 families and elders receiving meat and grocery vouchers.

Food from Home project

Gugan Gulwan conducted an online survey In April 2021 on nutrition, concerns and or issues relating to providing healthy foods/meals option including school-based lunches for their school aged children.

Gugan Gulwan Child, Youth and Family Support Program worked in partnership with the Tuggeranong Child and Family Centre to facilitate and deliver a Healthy Lunch Box program with subject matter expert Jeffrey Morgan, Health and Wellbeing Consultant, Nutritionist and Mentor.

The purpose and aim of the Healthy Lunchbox program was to provide information, tools, ideas and ways to encourage healthy eating within the early years of childhood, and how to manage fussy eaters.

The promotion of the program and sessions was delivered through a variety of mediums including via ACT Education Directorate, school newsletters, emails, SMS mass texting, social media, posters/ flyers, social media platforms and stakeholders.

Jeffrey Morgan with support from Gugan Gulwan and Tuggeranong Child and Family Centre delivered a number of healthy foods, lifestyle and nutrition sessions across the ACT including:

- Gugan Gulwan staffing team
- Lunchbox and nutrition sessions to students, parent/carers and staff across three Koori preschools in the ACT
- Community session at Gugan Gulwan
- Gugan Gulwan Young Men's and Young Women's Mentoring Group

Each participant who attended the workshops was provided with the Healthy Lunch box options, with ideas to pack their child lunches including recipes, meal preparation guides, the seven steps guide to eating healthy. To further support this initiative healthy eating boxes of fresh fruit were made available at each session for participants to take with a \$50 Woolworths essential voucher to assist them in their journey towards increased healthier lifestyles and food intake.

We are blessed to have our families, friends, and community. We are blessed that we in the ACT we have four seasons. We are blessed that we have nature and country on our doorstep.

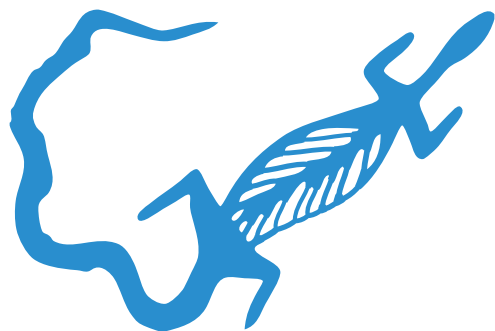
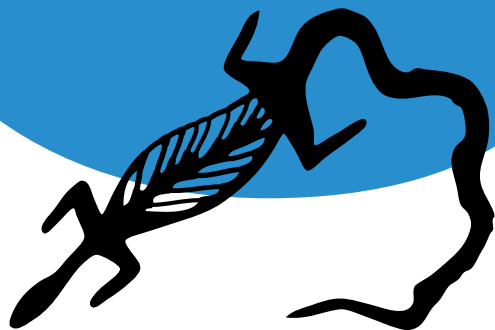
We need to care for each other more; not just as individuals, families, but as a community.

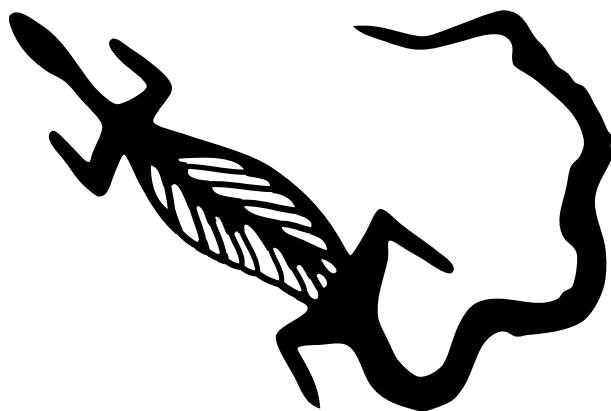
