## WHO WE ARE AND WHAT WE DO

Gugan Gulwan Youth Aboriginal Corporation was created to support the young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in the ACT and surrounding regions to thrive and succeed. Our commitment is to protect, nurture and support children, youth and their families as they grow — from birth, through childhood, adolescence and into adulthood.

The mandate of Gugan Gulwan is twofold. The first is to work with, and through, our many partners to establish a system of services and supports that strengthen families and help those of our children and youth who are experiencing vulnerability. The second is to lead advocacy and effective policy development on issues that affect all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and youth.

Since its creation, Gugan Gulwan has built considerable expertise in the area of child and youth development. This focus on positive development informs our role as a champion and catalyst for the outcomes of all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and youth in our region.

Gugan Gulwan actively shares our expertise with others and works in partnership to create opportunities for the voices of children and youth to be heard across the sector and within government. Successfully carrying out these roles requires a workforce with a broad range of skills, including: case management; community engagement, counselling, direct service delivery; policy development; program design; systems design; program evaluation and oversight; partnership development; financial and capital management: human resources: information technology: information management and analytics: organisational development; and administration. While not always visible, each of these functions is crucial for serving our region's young people effectively and responsibly.




# GUGAN GULWAN WELCOME PACKS

The Welcome Pack explains case management roles and responsibilities, how to make a complaint and self-care tips. The Welcome Pack has been a well-received resource for clients and case workers.

# QIC HEALTH AND COMMUNITY SERVICES STANDARDS 7TH ED

For the last two years Gugan Gulwan has been undertaking organisational gap analysis, self-assessment and formal external onsite assessment against QIP/AGPAL -QIC Health and Community Service Standards 7th Edition to further identify, improve and demonstrate robust organisational operating systems. Gugan Gulwan undertook formal external onsite assessment against these standards over two days in November 2018. On the 12 December 2018 Gugan Gulwan was formally accredited as meeting the Quality Innovation Performance-QIC Health and Community Services Standards 7th Ed standards. Gugan Gulwan is currently in their first three-year accreditation cycle and have developed and progressing a Quality Improvement Plan for the organisation.

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# GUGAN GULWAN GROUP PROGRAMS

#### Young Men's Mentoring Group

Gugan Gulwan's Young Men's Mentoring Group (YMMG) is a highly demanded upon program for young men aged between 8-12 years. The program aims to address and meet the identified needs of young men within this age range by delivering a program that incorporates cultural knowledge and practices, respectful relationships, health decision making and positive male role modeling by staff on the program.

#### Young Women's Mentoring Group

The Gugan Gulwan Young Women's Mentoring Group is for young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women between the ages of 12-14 years. The program is holistic in design and provides opportunities for the young women to engage in learning life skills, participate in group activities and educational information sessions. Participants in this program develop a deeper understanding of relevant contemporary issues affecting them, the ability to self-advocate and to improve their own personal development/identity in an environment that is safe, free from judgement and culturally sensitive.

To address and support the young women a tailored program of educational sessions and physical activities was developed in consultation with the young women.

Program content included: LGBTIQ education, bullying including cyber, healthy relationships, nutrition and women's health information sessions, living skills, and how to use and protect yourself on social media.

#### **Streetbeat Outreach Program**


Gugan Gulwan's Streetbeat Outreach program continues to delivery sexual health information and provide targeted support to young and vulnerable youth on Friday and Saturday nights.

The Streetbeat Outreach program continues to attend youth events such as NAIDOC Week, Koori Knockouts, Backbone BMX, Skateboard Events and Music Festivals where possible.

Over 5000 sexual health information kits were distributed to young people in the last 12 months.

#### **Gugan Gulwan School Holiday Program**

The Gugan Gulwan school holiday program continues to be a highly sought-after program for young people and their families. The program continues to focus on providing activities and support to young people that delivers learning, culture knowledge and practice, social and emotional wellbeing, healthy relationships and of course recreation into two fun filled weeks each holiday period.

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# FUNCTIONAL FAMILY THERAPY CHILD WELFARE

(FFT-CW)

The FFT-CW partnership program with OzChild began with the first families entering the program in November. The initial data has been very promising. The team have scored a fidelity rating of 5.83 which is 'uniquely' very, very high.

An analysis of the data was conducted, as the program is a first for the developer, and it would appear there are a number of drivers that are contributing to the team's high fidelity. The team have had zero families drop outs or refusal of service.

The therapists have shown an ability to gain trust, alliance and hope quickly with families. The data examined by the FFT consultant evidenced how quickly each therapist was able to gain trust and alliance with families in early sessions preparing them for behaviour change. The success in this work is thought to be heavily related to pre work Gugan Gulwan is undertakes with families in the Intake phase.

Gugan Gulwan spend a significant amount effort preparing families for FFT-CW before the referral is sent to the team for intake. This includes (but isn't limited to) engaging families and promoting the program and OzChild. Assisting families with Family Violence Orders to have the orders and/or bail conditions varied so both parents can attend sessions and reassuring and building confidence in families work with OzChild.

The consultant has reported that the team is very strong in behaviour change and they not only directly target the referral behaviours in their behaviour change plans but are able to plan and implement specific behavioural change that matches to each family based on their strengths. The behavioural change plans weave a cultural and clinical response.

The team spends a great deal of time planning for sessions and reviewing sessions alongside the cultural liaisons to ensure each family receives the highest quality of FFT-CW intervention delivered through a cultural lens.

There are 21 families in service noting that three of these families have 5 plus children therefore it is recognised as 24 families. This includes 68 children and young people.

#### INDIGENOUS DIGITAL EXCELLENCE (IDX) PROGRAM

Gugan Gulwan in collaboration with IDX program facilitated three digital making workshops in schools for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students from the 13-16 May 2019. The Indigenous Digital Excellence workshops aim to strengthen Indigenous participation, practice and entrepreneurship in the digital economy including: robotics, virtual reality, drones and digital storytelling.

#### **Gugan Gulwan Music Program**

The Gugan Gulwan Music program is designed to engage and support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young people in the ACT region who have an interest or passion for music. The music program is for young people at elemental or intermediate levels. The program provides a range of musical instruments with ongoing music tuition and performance opportunities.

In the last 12 months the music program has expanded to include mentors and instructors from the ANU School of Music who provide generalised and specific instrument tuition depending on the development level of the young person.

#### Parenting Our Way (POW) Program

Gugan Gulwan after feedback and consultation within the community re-introduced the Parenting Our Way program. The program aims to address the needs, issues and or concerns of the community by facilitating specific forums with subject matter experts. The process allows for questions, feedback and information to be shared with a focus of empowering parent and carers capacity.

#### **Community Arts Program**

Gugan Gulwan Community Arts program is comprised of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young people currently receiving treatment for alcohol, drug and or mental health issues. The program is designed to alleviate isolation and exclusion with a number of young people coming from interstate for support and treatment.

Art therapy is recognised as a therapeutic method of engaging clients in self-healing, expression, treatment, rehabilitation and addressing any current or previous behaviours of concern. The program has a strong cultural foundation that further enhances the individual's understanding of self.

#### **Tutoring Program**

The Gugan Gulwan Tutoring Program is an individualised program of support for young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students who are needing additional one on one learning support in the ACT region.

The program delivered by Canberra Tutoring aims to addresses and support the challenges many young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students face to remain engaged in education and learning.

#### **Drop In and Lunch Program**

The Gugan Gulwan Drop In and Lunch program over the last 12 months provided direct and indirect support to students across the ACT region. The Drop In and Lunch programs provide a soft entry point and introduction for young people regarding the supports and services available through Gugan Gulwan. The Gugan Gulwan Lunch program is mobile and is frequently delivered across schools, community events and within other Gugan Gulwan programs. The Gugan Gulwan Drop In program attracts a lot of young people seeking a safe and support environment. The Drop In program runs fours days a week at Gugan Gulwan.

#### **Gugan Gulwan and Brothers 4 Recovery**

Gugan Gulwan partnered with Brothers 4 Recovery to come to ACT and deliver their Breaking the Cycles of Addiction workshops to young people aged 14 years and older in September 2018

Gugan Gulwan contacted schools across the ACT to host the workshops. Four schools across the ACT region took up this opportunity and hosted the workshop with approximately 250 students participating. Gugan Gulwan were also successful in being able to run the workshop at Bimberi Juvenile Detention Centre; whilst the attendance in this workshop was smaller in numbers the impact and shared experiences was far greater.

Louise has also been involved in a wide range of roles in the community sector and with professional associations including as chair of the Women's Legal Centre, the Family Violence Intervention Program, UNSW Indigenous Law Centre and as a member of the Law Council of Australia's Indigenous Legal Issues Committee.

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# CHILD, YOUTH AND FAMILY SERVICES TEAM

The Gugan Gulwan Child, Youth and Family Support Team had a busy 12 months delivering services through case management, group programs, youth engagement and therapeutic services.

The Gugan Gulwan, Child, Youth and Family Support Team is comprised of three workers with a specific expertise including an Early Childhood, Family Support and Youth Worker. The positions allow the team to be a wrap around and holistic case management service for the individual and family.

114 individuals and families were provided support in the 12-month period.

1,112 young people participated in Gugan Gulwan group programs in the 12-month period.



# GUGAN GULWAN RECONNECT TEAM



Gugan Gulwan's Reconnect Team have had a productive 12 months supporting young people aged 12-18 years at risk of homelessness and or disengagement from education.

The Reconnect team primary focus has been to maintain and further build relationships within the school network as a referral pathway for support. Reconnect have worked in collaboration to extend services into schools with the delivery of drug and alcohol information sessions with Brothers 4 Recovery, and the Indigenous Digital Excellence program.

Over the 12-month period Reconnect provided case management support to 51 young people with 547 occasions of support recorded.

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# JOE WILLIAMS COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH WELLNESS SESSION

On 23rd October 2018, Gugan Gulwan hosted a Community Mental Health Wellness Session with 81 people in attendance.

The session was facilitated by Joe Williams, who, in 2018 won the Coveted National LIFE Award for Excellence in Suicide Prevention for his continued work in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Communities across Australia.

Joe presented an inspiring and honest session, sharing his story including his ongoing struggles with his own mental health, and how, over the years having been a public figure as a former NRL player with South Sydney Rabbitohs and a boxer, he has coped daily in maintaining a good level of mental health.


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# DRUG AND ALCOHOL / MENTAL HEALTH TEAM



Gugan Gulwan's financial result for the year ended 30 June 2019 is a surplus of \$54,628 (2018 surplus: \$70,967).


