### Who we are and what we do

Gugan Gulwan Youth Aboriginal Corporation was created to support young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in the ACT and surrounding regions to thrive and succeed. Our commitment is to protect, nurture and support children, youth and their families as they grow – from birth, through childhood, adolescence and into adulthood.

The mandate of Gugan Gulwan is twofold. The first is to work with, and through, our many partners to establish a system of services and supports that strengthen families and help those of our children and youth who are experiencing vulnerability. The second is to lead advocacy and effective policy development on issues that affect all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and youth.

Since its creation, Gugan Gulwan has built considerable expertise in the area of child and youth development. This focus on positive development informs our role as a champion and catalyst for the outcomes of all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and youth in our region.

Gugan Gulwan actively shares our expertise with others and works in partnership to create opportunities for the voices of children and youth to be heard across the sector and within government. Successfully carrying out these roles requires a workforce with a broad range of skills, including: case management; community engagement, counselling, direct service delivery; policy development; program design; systems design; program evaluation and oversight; partnership development; financial and capital management; human resources; information technology; information management and analytics; organisational development; and administration. While not always visible, each of these functions is crucial for serving our region's young people effectively and responsibly.

### Our Strategic Priorities

Our strategic priorities for the next five years have a strong focus on continuing and strengthening Gugan Gulwan'sleadership and governance to deliver a culturally safe and professional service to ensure our people have a service that is community owned and led. This is to ensure that our voice is authorised and empowered in every aspect of their lives. It is fundamental that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples need to be part of the decision-making process and be supported to lead and guide the implementation of solutions for challenges that are about them.

We will maintain prevention andearly intervention focus with the provision of support for and resourcing of good practice Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander led prevention approaches. We will continue to strengthen our community leadership and cultural authority to engage, advise, and influence government policy makers, funding bodies, other stakeholders and partners to consider how child, youth and family challenges and services are developed, addressed, and provided to the ACT Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community.

To achieve our strategic priorities, we will strive for a fit for purpose facility to be able to better meet the needs of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community and allow for growth.

This report highlights the organisation's achievements and challenges over the past year as we continued to deliver a remarkably wide range of support services for young people, families, and overall community.

It is a privilege to be on the Board of Gugan Gulwan and to be able to represent and support the views of the ACT First Nations community. The community's contribution has helped shape and determine the ongoing vision of the organisation.

Gugan Gulwan's mandate and primary responsibility is to stakeholders and the community, and it does not seek to deliver programs and services that are not meeting the needs and demands of the local community. Gugan Gulwan actively strives to enable community voices to be front and centre.

Navigating the COVID-19 pandemic has been a continuing challenge this year, impacting our staffing levels at various times. Throughout, our staff and management team have been flexible, positive, and committed to delivering quality services to clients. I commend

everyone in the organisation for their professionalism and resilience this year and throughout the pandemic.

In 2021–22, Gugan Gulwan continued to enhance our work as a best practice Aboriginal First Nations youth centre delivering to ACT, Queanbeyan and Yass. Sharing our considerable experience in youth, families, and community. Where appropriate, Gugan Gulwan continues to provide policy and legislative advice, through representation on numerous committees. This enables Gugan Gulwan to participate in reform to the ACT Government Departments/Directorates with a clear focus on First Nations youth issues.

There have been a number of highlights throughout the year, the 2 most significant is we celebrated our 30th year of service to the community during NAIDOC Week and we will be getting a new building which will be on the same site as the existing building but knock down and rebuild, we are very excited by this and can't wait.

On behalf of the Board, I want to acknowledge Kim, your drive, commitment and dedication knows no limits, Gugan would not be the service it is today, providing a wholistic culturally safe organisation to our community, I have no words that truly express our appreciation for all that you do apart from a heartfelt thank you.

To the staff of Gugan who are often working with extremely complex issues, difficult environments, and systemic barriers that you often hit up against, you do amazing work in supporting our community and our Board thanks you too and appreciates all that you do.

### Executive Director's Report

Another challenging year, once again, our team were reminded just how fragile our state of 'new normalcy' was as we re-entered lockdown in August 2021.

As a team Gugan Gulwan were better prepared for the second lockdown, putting in place several measures to ensure the community were supporting in the best way possible. These included, food supplies, provision of cleaning products, high presence on social media, provision of skip bins, art supplies and information in general on what to do if community caught COVID-19. As we seen cases rise, it was imperative to provide clear and concise information. This continued into the new year with cases continuing to rise over the Christmas period. This led into vaccinations against Covid and the emergence of new variants.

Gugan Gulwan successfully completed the second cycle of formal accreditation in September 2021, with external assessors evaluating all program and services delivered by the organisation including through QIP /AGPAL against the QIC Health and Community Services Standards 7th Edition. A fantastic achievement whilst navigating lockdown.

Despite the challenges, Gugan Gulwan continued to deliver as a service moving into 2022 where the Organisation were planning to celebrate 30 years of service to the ACT community. A huge effort,

which demanded celebration no matter the trying conditions we would face moving forward.

With the announcement of a new purpose-built facility for Gugan on the grounds of the current building, Gugan Gulwan were required to relocate to Erindale Business Park in May 2022, which brought about a whole new set of challenges. The organisation was required to separate into different building at Erindale Business Park whilst continuing service delivery. Once again, another hurdle that the service was required to navigate.

Looking back over the year, so much has happened, and so much has been achieved. We are a service that is resilient, skilled, and accountable.

To my staff—I cannot speak highly enough of you all, your dedication, commitment, and skills are on show every single day. While we certainly celebrate our success, we also acknowledge that we are not always perfect; we can drop the ball when it comes to sound service delivery. However, we pick ourselves up, self-reflect as to why we work in this environment and move on.

To the Board of Directors, thank you for your support, your direction and unwavering commitment to this organisation. It does not go unnoticed; you are appreciated, and I value you more than I can express in words. Successful leadership creates a clear vision of what this organization can achieve.



### Covid-19 Lockdown

13 August – October 15 21



Throughout lockdown Gugan Gulwan remained operational (skeleton staff on site, remaining staff working remotely) and facilitated direct support to community members with fresh fruit/vegetable and meat hampers across the ACT, Queanbeyan, and Yass region.

A focus for Gugan Gulwan was promoting and distributing relevant COVID-19 information to the ACT First Nation's community with themes promoting adherence to government restrictions, getting tested and vaccinated. Gugan Gulwan social media become a direct communication tool for community and reached over 190,000 people from August-October 2021 with over 520 social media posts published.

Within the lockdown period Gugan Gulwan provided in addition to their regular service delivery over 1400 occasions of service including:

### Gugan Gulwan Planning Day 2022

Gugan Gulwan values staff planning days to ensure that the team is working as effectively as possible with the limited resources afforded to them. As a First Nations service it is vital Gugan Gulwan works to provide the best service possible within the resources available and proper planning is vital to this process.

The 2022 planning day looked at key areas, such as:

- Management address to staff expectations
- Setting the scene for the year ahead
- Team presentations
- Self-Care and strategies for implementation
- Review of the previous year
- What works well, what do we change
- Group program reviews
- Impacts of COVID-19
- Setting boundaries
- Burnout due to vicarious trauma

### Case Management

The mandate of the Gugan Gulwan Case Management Service is to provide all clients with a sound service, with continuity of care and follow-up. It is important that these Guidelines are followed when a member of staff at Gugan Gulwan is required to undertake Case Management with a client.

Case management is a collaborative process of assessment, planning, facilitation, coordination, evaluation, and advocacy for options and services to meet an individual and family's comprehensive needs through communication and available resources.

The role of the case manager is to follow the processes through the core functions of case managers. Its function is to assist young people, and their families, to build a positive life in which they can meet their needs while assisting to build strength and resilience within the individual and family.

A total of 91 families received Case Management.

### **QIP** Accreditation

Gugan Gulwan successfully completed its second cycle of formal accreditation in September 2021 with external assessors evaluating all programs and services delivered by the organisation including through QIP /AGPAL against the QIC Health and Community Services Standards 7th Edition. Programs and sections assessed included:

- Child Youth and Family Support
- Drug and Alcohol/Mental Health
- Reconnect
- Administration
- Management

The formal accreditation scope of assessment also included the review of processes and systems including organisational governance, management systems, consumer and community engagement, diversity and cultural appropriateness, and service delivery. Gugan Gulwan successfully achieved accreditation against these standards until September 2024.

### Group Programs

### Tutoring Program

The Gugan Gulwan Tutoring Program is an individualised program of support for First Nations young people who are needing additional one on one learning support in the ACT region.

The program addresses the challenges many First Nations students face to remain engaged in education and learning. Through the tutoring program strategies of learning are identified to maintain and progress the child's current learning and education.

The Gugan Gulwan tutoring program is delivered by Canberra Tutoring who can deliver the tutoring sessions in home or at another mutually agreed upon location.

Through the Gugan Gulwan tutoring program students receive 10 x 1-hour tutoring sessions at no cost.

A total of 320 Sessions of Tutoring were delivered 1 July 21 – 30 June 22.

### Back to School Packs

Gugan Gulwan continues to deliver the Back to School program with demand increasing each year. This was especially so this year with the cost of living increases faced by many families.

This year the program included school uniform assistance, assistance to purchase either shoes or school uniforms as well as bags, lunchboxes, drink bottles and laptop covers.

The Back to School packs were offered through out the ACT, Queanbeyan and surrounds including Yass.

The program assisted 181 families with uniforms or shoes, 150 Junior Students received bags, lunch boxes and drink bottles and 200 Senior students received bags, laptop covers and drink bottles.



### Young Men's Mentoring Group

The Young Men's Mentoring Group continues to experience high demand as there is an identified service gap in programs for young First Nation's men in this age cohort. At the commencement of the program the young men and staff discuss desired program content and outcomes and agree on a mutual way of working and communicating together. The staff and mentors on the program provide strong role modelling of behaviours for the young men on the program so they can navigate and learn positive relationships and communication. Cultural practice and knowledge are an intrinsic strength of this program as some of the young men are disconnected or lack knowledge of their culture. Through the YMMG program the young men learn, practice, and discuss cultural men's business.

### Young Women's Group

The Young Women's Group (YWG) continue to undertake a variety of activities throughout this reporting period. Due to the COVID-19 outbreak and lockdowns in the ACT, Group Programs proceeded to operate online weekly. A challenge and success of the program throughout the lockdown period has been keeping the young women engaged with the group which is also helped alleviate the social isolation. During the lockdown period participation within the YWMG decreased due to online fatigue and exhaustion.

2022 saw an increase in attendance of the Young Women's Group with participants craving face to face contact. The group addressed issues such as social isolation, community issues, arts for therapy, living skills, mental health.

### School Holiday Program

A continuing focus for the school holiday program in 2021/22 was identifying new activities that encompassed healthy lifestyle activities. Gugan Gulwan school holiday program is a culturally safe and competent school holiday program for our First Nation's young people. Activities and events are sought that help strengthen and develop young people's understanding of culture.

A unique component to our school holiday program is the opportunity we provide for young people aged 16 years to participate in the delivery of the school holiday program as an assistant/mentor on the program. The young people on the program have scheduled hours, program responsibilities, supervision and engagement of young people and provide evidence of WWVP status. All program assistants receive a monetary payment for their contribution. Being an assistant on the program supports young adults develop and manage responsibilities whilst providing tangible work experience.

### Music Program

During the pandemic our programs moved to online and multimedia formats. Moving our Music Program to this format allowed participants to engage with their Tutor one on one via Zoom weekly. Broader Group sessions were challenging but continued to run. Once programs shifted back to in person it became apparent that Northside residents were not able to access the Music program.

Previously some did attend ANU and were able to resume this, but other families indicated this was not an option. To meet this need Gugan Gulwan has continued the Zoom sessions for all participants that have requested this format.

The program concentrated on the performing troop which consists of 3 artists who are singer performers along with the ANU Tutors who rehearsed with our performers for our NAIDOC events. In addition to this Gugan Gulwan's recording program commenced in February and continued until May providing our students with recording experience as well as providing backing music for live performances. This program is sponsored through ANU School of Music My Song program.

### Streetbeat Outreach Program

The Gugan Gulwan Streetbeat Youth Outreach Program is a tailored health program to reach vulnerable First Nations youth in the ACT region. It operates on Friday and Saturday nights between the hours of 7-11pm, targeting meeting places and identified "trouble spots".

The program can provide diversionary and or immediate support to individuals with a broad range of information, resources, and services. The geographic scope of the delivery of this program is Canberra, Yass and Queanbeyan region. 2 665 sexual health information kits were distributed to young people in the last 6-month period. Male: 917. Female 427. Patrols 52

### Community Arts for Therapy

Community Arts for Therapy is designed for Community Groups to attend Gugan Gulwan outreach programs facilitated at various venues.

The Program is designed for young people to have a stronger connection to their culture and community, developing living skills, creativity, art, understanding of the effects of use and misuse of drugs and alcohol, building support networks and becoming more aware of their relationships, and building a rapport with the Gugan Gulwan staff for further support and/or case management.

Several services access the program such as Ted Noffs, young bra's group, Worldview, Clontarf. The program is also delivered at the Alexander Moconochie Centre (AMC) and Bimberi Youth Detention Centre.

### Yass High School Program

This program, funding by Growing Healthy Families, supports activities to improve First Nations educational outcomes, opening the door to more options of pathways to success. The program can include many things that assist families to achieve the best outcomes for children and young people. The program has a critical focus on increased school attendance and improved educational outcomes that lead to employment.

### Outcomes

- Support families to give children a good start in life through improved early childhood development, care, education, and school readiness.
- Get children to school.
- Improve literacy and numeracy.
- Support successful transitions to further education and work.

### Drop in Program

The Gugan Gulwan Drop-In program continues to provide a soft entry point and introduction for direct and indirect support to students across the ACT region. Gugan Gulwan readily engage with the young people accessing the Centre to ensure needs are being met. Within this 12-month period 223 young people accessed the Drop In Program.

Young people attending the Drop-in Program engage in recreation pool, table tennis and online gaming facilities. Gugan provides a phone charging unit and healthy food options for all young people accessing the Centre.

Moving to new premises at Erindale Business Park has seen a marked decrease in drop in participants due to its location. This will be ongoing until the new purpose-built facility is built.

### Parenting Our Way

Gugan Gulwan Parenting Our Way program is delivered to parent/ carers in the community to and for our First Nation's children and families.

The program provides opportunities for families to engage in the learning and development of life skills, group activities and educational information sessions. Participants in this program receive practical parental support, advice and information on issues affecting them. The program is delivered in an environment that is safe, free from judgement and culturally sensitive.

Parenting our way introduced online cooking classes with Malcolm Towney and Budda Connors throughout lockdown, which proved successful. The aim of the classes was to introduce humour and offer parents an opportunity to cook with their children. It was well received by the community.

Gugan felt the need for families to remain connected and undertake family activities. This was evident through the views, shares and feedback provided through Facebook, emails, phone calls and evaluations.

The social and emotional connectedness that the cooking sessions provided was overwhelming from families. Families reported that these sessions provided them with laughter, fun activity, something that the family could do together and something enjoyable to do.

Gugan also had face to face parenting our way sessions in the second half of the year involving Jeff Amatto - More Cultural Rehabs, less jails. Joe Williams provided a customised workshop to invited community to share his experiences and speak about the role Trauma plays within the community and impacts upon Mental Health. Joe specifically focused on the impacts of vicarious trauma. The workshop was targeted toward those who have a history of trauma but struggle to understand the impacts of trauma related behaviour in their parenting.

### Gugan Gulwan Lunch Program

The Gugan Gulwan Lunch program is mobile and can be delivered in schools, external community events and within other Gugan Gulwan programs. The Gugan Gulwan Lunch program is an informal pathway for young people to access information and supports and focus age group is young people aged 12-25 years.

Due to the ongoing impacts of the health emergency, the Gugan Gulwan Lunch Program has been limited in its capacity to deliver the program in an outreach capacity within school/colleges and exposure locations.

Moving forward the lunch program will be required to operate in an outreach capacity due to Gugan Gulwan moving to Erindale Business Park where barriers exist due to space problems and decline in drop in numbers.

Gugan Gulwan also wanted to celebrate and share their '2021 Organisation of the Year' award that was announced at the local NAIDOC ball.

A significant and collaborative achievement leading up to the event was the handmade NAIDOC Youth Awards that were created through a variety of outreach programs Gugan Gulwan delivers including young people detained in justice settings and young people working with services to address drug and or alcohol concerns.

245 community members attended the event.



### Youth Week

Gugan Gulwan delivered a Youth Week event Thursday 7th of April 2022, it comprised of a 3x3 Basketball Competition for participants aged 7 - 17, and wider community members. The event was well attended by more than 250 community members.

The 3x3 Basketball competition had 21 teams. This was a large increase from the previous year where 8 teams participated. The event day saw a lot of rain, so the event was moved from the Courts outside Gugan Gulwan to Erindale College from 12.30pm-2.30pm. The competition was action packed and hotly contested by the participating teams and was exciting to watch. A community BBQ lunch was provided as part of the event with over 250 youth and community members in attendance.

Basketball ACT supported the event by providing two staff members to come along and help Gugan with the 3x3 competition, they also assisted by being our experienced referee's. Jade Melbourne from the UC Canberra Capitals WNBL volunteered on the day. Jade was a wonderful guest and spoke with many of the young aspiring Basketball players.

### Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children's Day 2021

Gugan Gulwan celebrated Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children's Day on Tuesday the 3 August 2021 at Richardson Pre-school.

Gugan Gulwan was approached by Richardson Primary School to work in collaboration with them to finish painting their Aboriginal Totem poles that they had displayed in the pre-school playground area.

Under the Growing Healthy Families Program Gugan Gulwan worked collaboratively with the school to finish the totem poles in time to celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children Day.

With the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children's Day theme being Proud in Cultural, Strong in Spirit. Gugan Gulwan invited Dream Time Connection a local Aboriginal Artist to deliver a bush tucker program to the children and start planting some native plants in the school garden.

On the day of the event 5 staff from Gugan Gulwan attended and participated in the morning celebrations. The event was open by acknowledgement to Country by Malcolm Towney followed by an acknowledgement delivered by the children. WIN news was invited along to film the event and interview some of the artists who assisted with designing the poles.

The children were divided into 4 groups who would rotate to different workstations to complete different activities followed by morning tea.

- Bush Tucker workshop with Dream Time Connections
- Handprints on totem poles
- Painting handprints to be placed in the garden
- Cooking painting workshop that the kids got to take home at the end of the day.

Gugan Gulwan also purchased the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children's Day activity bags for Richardson, Wanniassa and Narrabundah Koori preschool students to enjoy.

- Total of participants for the event: 50
- Total bag delivered: 150

### Gugan Gulwan R U Ok Event -9th September 2021

R U Ok Day is a National initative to ensure that communities are regularly checking in with family, friends and community by asking R U Ok? To spread the message to the ACT Community Gugan Gulwan organised videos of staff and local First Nation's people to share their message around R U Ok Day via Gugan's Gulwan social media platforms. Young people developed posters and drawings on what R U Ok Day means to them and these were also shared via social media. The videos were extremely popular reaching over 3500 people.

Gugan Gulwan hosted an online community yarn up event that was supported and attended by Relationships Australia's Dhunlung Yarra counsellors. This online event gave the opportunity or community members to have a yarn about where they are at with their mental health and the current lockdown restrictions. Many community members voiced their frustration, anxiety, concerns about the lockdown, ongoing worry for family members and the uncertainty moving forward.

Gugan Gulwan launched new mental health suicide prevention resources including:

- Posters
- Sherpas
- Information and resource cards
- Stress footballs
- Laptop pouches
- Mouse pads
- Air fresheners
- Street Beat Sexual Health Packs

I would also like to thank KPMG who have continued as Gugan Gulwan's Auditor for the year ended 30 June 2022.


