

Who we are and what we do

Gugan Gulwan Youth Aboriginal Corporation was created to support young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in the ACT and surrounding regions to thrive and succeed. Our commitment is to protect, nurture and support children, youth and their families as they grow – from birth, through childhood, adolescence and into adulthood.

The mandate of Gugan Gulwan is twofold. The first is to work with, and through, our many partners to establish a system of services and supports that strengthen families and help those of our children and youth who are experiencing vulnerability. The second is to lead advocacy and effective policy development on issues that affect all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and youth.

Since its creation, Gugan Gulwan has built considerable expertise in the area of child and youth development. This focus on positive development informs our role as a champion and catalyst for the outcomes of all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and youth in our region.

Gugan Gulwan actively shares our expertise with others and works in partnership to create opportunities for the voices of children and youth to be heard across the sector and within government. Successfully carrying out these roles requires a workforce with a broad range of skills, including: case management; community engagement, counselling, direct service delivery; policy development; program design; systems design; program evaluation and oversight; partnership development; financial and capital management; human resources; information technology; information management and analytics; organisational development; and administration. While not always visible, each of these functions is crucial for serving our region's young people effectively and responsibly.

Our Strategic Priorities

Our strategic priorities for the next five years have a strong focus on continuing and strengthening Gugan Gulwan's leadership and governance to deliver a culturally safe and professional service to ensure our people have a service that is community owned and led. This is to ensure that our voice is authorised and empowered in every aspect of their lives. It is fundamental that First Nations peoples need to be part of the decision-making process and be supported to lead and guide the implementation of solutions for challenges that are about them.

We will maintain prevention and early intervention focus with the provision of support for and resourcing of good practice Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander led prevention approaches. We will continue to strengthen our community leadership and cultural authority to engage, advise, and influence government policy makers, funding bodies, other stakeholders and partners to consider how child, youth and family challenges and services are developed, addressed, and provided to the ACT Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community.

To achieve our strategic priorities, we will strive for a fit for purpose facility to be able to better meet the needs of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community and allow for growth.



30 Year Celebrations

One of the most significant milestones this year was the celebration of Gugan Gulwan Youth Aboriginal Organisations 30th year anniversary. We marked the occasion with a memorable NAIDOC event that brought together our community and supporters. This event not only celebrated our history but also served as a reminder of the important work ahead.

Kids Xmas Party

In the spirit of giving and spreading joy, Gugan and Winnunga organised a kids Christmas party before Xmas, it was heartwarming to see so many families and smiles on the faces of the children and families who attended, it was a bigger event then previous years, the event reinforced our commitment to nurturing a sense of belonging and happiness among the children and young people that we serve.

R U OK Day - Walkabout Barber

Mental health and wellbeing are central to Gugan's mission and values, and we actively participate in the R U OK Day campaign. Our Walkabout Barber event provided a safe and supportive space for children and young people to connect, talk about their mental health and receiving haircuts and other grooming services, it was a day of open conversations and mutual support.

Children's Day 2022

Children's Day holds a special place in our hearts, and we celebrate it with enthusiasm. This day allows us to promote cultural pride and the importance of children within our community. Through a range of activities, we aim to empower our children and young people.

Commissioning

Gugan has continued to participate in the commissioning process with the ACT Government. Commissioning is the process by which health, care and social services are planned, purchased and monitored by funding bodies. It is a collaborative practice of codesign to best service local communities by addressing local need.

Short Staffed

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QIP Accreditation

Gugan Gulwan successfully completed its third midterm cycle formal accreditation in May 2023 with an external assessor evaluating the organisation Improvement Plan against the QIC Health and Community Services Standards 7th Edition. Programs and sections assessed included:

- Child Youth and Family Support
- Drug and Alcohol/Mental Health
- Reconnect
- Administration
- Management

Feedback from the process included:

Gugan Gulwan set a practical and achievable improvement plan for itself based on the results of their last assessment. The organisation has completed 50% of this plan, and work has commenced on the remaining 50%.

Importantly the organisation has taken a systems approach to ensure that improvements are documented, implemented, and monitored to measure the effectiveness of the results and to identify and address any unintended consequences.

It was noted during the mid-cycle assessment that:

 Staff have been actively involved in guiding the direction of the CQI activities, thereby maximising their buy-in to any changes rolled out because of the activity. • Progress is tracking positively in terms of timeframes in the remaining 50% of improvement and all are expected to be completed prior to the next assessment in 18 months' time.

Gugan Gulwan is to be congratulated on their achievements to date against the quality work plan. This is particularly impressive given the loss of key staff, challenges in recruiting new staff with the required skills set and introduction of a commissioning model for funding in the ACT. It is testament to the strong culture of quality improvement that exists within the organisation and its commitment to achieve effective governance, operations, service delivery and outcomes.

Case Management

Gugan Gulwan provides comprehensive case management. Two workers, often from different teams within Gugan Gulwan, assist all clients as clients do not present with just one issue. Gugan Gulwan Case Management uses the strength of family, community, and culture as part of an individualised case plan. All Case Management Plans are developed with the clients, their family and any other important people nominated by the client as being helpful to their case management goals. Case management plans are frequently assessed and redesigned as the client reaches, or changes, goals. Where there is a referral provided to a client Gugan Gulwan practises warm referrals and continues wrap around case management until the client has engaged with the other service. This assists workers to ensure clients do not slip through the gaps.

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Community Support Program

Case managers have seen clients, families and the community heavily impacted by cost-of-living increases. These increases have created financial hardship that is being felt by all families engaging with Gugan Gulwan.

These cost-of-living pressures are contributing to families falling into arrears particularly with rent and utilities. Both contribute to failure to sustain tenancy. As a result of feedback from families Gugan Gulwan planned and implemented a utilities support payment during the reporting period.

This is an ongoing program which, so far, has supported **thirty-nine** families. In conjunction with this program Gugan Gulwan staff have connected with the ACAT- energy and water program to assist families who are not able to pay their debts.

Engagement with this program has allowed for families to have debt reduction put in place along with a guarantee that utilities will not be cut off. Gugan Gulwan has also enabled families to engage with the Staying Connected program.

During the reporting period Gugan Gulwan continued to aid families with carpet cleaning and pest control as an initiative to assist families to maintain tenancies. **Fifty-five** families have been assisted with the program during this reporting period. Issues impacting upon sustainability of tenancies impact upon family's ability to provide for the basic needs of children.

Overcrowding and inappropriate accommodation result in issues retaining tenancies due to wear and tear on carpet, lack of appropriate garbage removal and pest infestation. This program is in response to client feedback about this situation.

Social and Emotional Support

During Sorry Business, the support provided by Gugan Gulwan encompasses support for the family from the Executive Director which can take many forms including emotional, financial assistance and navigating the process. The Executive Director also provides support to staff as burn out is a risk. Gugan Gulwan staff also assist in preparing the memorial booklets through to having it printed, attending the funeral, and providing aftercare that is tailored specifically to the family and community. This may also include supporting other community members who are still struggling with grief and loss from other losses. The process is complex as it often involves staff members' family members.

Gugan Gulwan Planning Day 2023

Curijo was engaged to design, develop, and facilitate the Gugan Gulwan Youth Aboriginal Corporation Annual Planning days for 2023. The objective of the Annual Planning days was to bring the team together to reflect, refresh and plan for 2023 to support Gugan to meet the organisations objectives in line with the strategic direction. Planning and self-care were a focus to ensure that staff wellbeing is a focus to be able to continue to provide culturally safe and high-quality early intervention and preservation offerings to the First Nations community of the ACT.

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Group Programs Gugan Gulwan uses Group Programs as a soft entruit service. Group Program

Gugan Gulwan uses Group Programs as a soft entry into the service. Group Programs provide a useful way to explore mental, physical, social, and emotional wellbeing. If issues arise during Group Programs Case management can begin. Young Women's Group and Young Men's Mentoring Group, along with the other Group Programs offered, introduce Gugan Gulwan to clients.

Tutoring Program

There are many reasons parents within our First Nations community choose tutoring for their children. Some parents feel unable to help their children with schoolwork. Others may find their children are more receptive to working through school struggles with another person. Tutoring can help strengthen subject comprehension, boost confidence, and build important learning skills.

The Gugan Gulwan Tutoring Program is an individualised program of support for young First Nations students who are needing additional one on one learning support in the ACT region.

The program addresses the challenges many young First Nations students face to remain engaged in education and learning. The Tutoring program is free for eligible students for a maximum of 10/1hr sessions per year.

The Gugan Gulwan Tutoring program is for students completing Year Two to Year Twelve.

Return to School Program

Back to school Program (Summer /Winter Assistance)

Gugan Gulwan delivered a Back-to-School support program to the community. This program is highly successful and is a much-welcomed initiative for our community. It aims to assist families with school uniforms, shoes & a school bags for the high school students and for the primary school students each child also received a lunch box and drink bottle with their school bags.

This program has been extremely effective in providing valuable support to parents/carers of First Nations young people to assist in returning to school with the required equipment to enable students to feel more comfortable within their school community.

During the reporting period Gugan Gulwan assisted **226** young people with summer and winter school assistance.

Koori Preschool Program

Small school bags and school shirts were purchased for each child attending Koori Preschools located in the ACT during 2023.

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Young Men's Mentoring Group (YMMG)

This year the Young Men's Mentoring Group (YMMG) participated in a wide variety of activities.

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Music Program

The Gugan Gulwan Music program is designed to engage and support First Nations young people in the ACT region who have an interest or passion for music. The program is delivered weekly during school terms. The music program is designed for young people at elementary or intermediate levels. The program provides a range of musical instruments with ongoing music tuition through a valued partnership with ANU School of Music. Gugan Gulwan Music participants were given the opportunity to perform at the Australian National University School of Music. This gave participants the opportunity to showcase their talent and perform for their families and community members. For those who were unable to attend the event, live viewing was provided via Gugan's Facebook Page.

In addition to this, participants have taken part in **6** professional recording sessions at Yilul Studios at the ANU.

15 participants their families attended the Reconciliation concert at the Canberra Theatre to see the achievements of former students. The former students shared the stage with Yothu Yindi in a celebration of voices, stories, and Music.

15 participants attended 36 sessions.

Youth Lunch Program

The Lunch Program is a tailored outreach program that is a soft entry point for clients who may be experiencing exclusion due to behaviors of concern. The program is responsive to community needs and is delivered in different locations, events, and schools across the ACT region.

The core objectives and outcomes of the Gugan Gulwan Lunch Program are to engage and support, referrals and linkages, promotion of cultural learnings and community inclusion.

Gugan Gulwan achieves the objectives by providing a culturally safe space where young people can access healthy food while talking to Gugan workers about a range of topics. It also gives workers the opportunity to introduce Gugan and, where appropriate, offer Case management services.

During the reporting period the program was delivered at:

There were 7 sessions delivered.

School Holiday Program

During the reporting period Gugan Gulwan delivered four School Holiday Programs. Week one consists of participants aged from 8-11 years and week two participants aged from 12-16 years. The School Holiday Program is promoted throughout Schools, social media, and within Community Organisations. Experience shows this delivery is most effective to capture our target audience.

Gugan Gulwan School Holiday Program activities are designed to promote social inclusion, cultural connectiveness, cultural safety and enjoyment for our young people.

A total of 128 young people were serviced through this program.

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Arts for Therapy Group at Alexander Maconochie Centre (AMC)/ Bimberi Youth Detention Centres

The Drug and Alcohol Arts for Therapy Group at AMC is comprised of young men and women who are currently detained, and who may have experienced alcohol and other drug issues and or mental health issues.

Arts for therapy is recognised as a therapeutic method of engaging clients in self-healing, expression, treatment, rehabilitation and addressing any current or previous behaviours of concern. The program has a strong cultural foundation that further enhances the individual's understanding of self.

There were 22 sessions facilitated at Bimberi with 16 participants.

There were 12 sessions facilitated at AMC with 18 participants.



Streetbeat Outreach Program

Gugan Gulwan Street Beat Youth Outreach Program is a tailored health program to reach vulnerable First Nations youth in the ACT region by providing a soft entry point for support for young people through provision of preventative health packs which contain condoms, drink spiking kits and lubricant as well as some contact points for help. These packs are distributed on Friday and Saturday nights from 7pm-11pm, targeting meeting places and identified hot spots across ACT and surrounding region. The service is also being promoted as a diversionary program for young First Nations youth aged 12-25 years.

Condom Packs distributed to young people have details about Gugan, Winnunga, Aboriginal Legal Service and Sexual Health and Family Planning. After Hours Emergency contact details appear on the pack. During distribution workers have a casual, respectful conversation about the packs but also about safety and wellbeing. Over the reporting period StreetBeat Staff have distributed 2557 Condom packs. 1,529 to Males, 1,028 to Females.

Community Arts for Therapy

The Gugan Gulwan Community Arts for Therapy program is delivered to young people who are participants from Ted Noffs, Healing Farm, Worldview and Kaleen High School.

Community Arts for Therapy is designed for Community Groups to attend Gugan Gulwan outreach programs facilitated at Burrunju Arts Gallery. The main objective of the program includes Engagement, promotion of healthy lifestyles, creating social networks, cultural learning, behaviour management, positive role modelling and mentoring.

The participants also took part in the Police Citizens Youth Club Touch Footy competition arranged by PCYC & Youth Coalition. This was a great way to celebrate Youth Week over the entire week with other services rather than a stand-alone event. It provided participants from all over the ACT an opportunity to engage with experiences they may not have otherwise tried.





Yass High School Program

This program supports activities to improve First Nations educational outcomes, opening the door to more options of pathways to success. This includes introducing families to services where a focus is on improving family and parenting support; early childhood development, care and education; school education; youth engagement and transition; and tertiary education. The program has a critical focus on providing families with service options with a focus on increased school attendance and improved educational outcomes that lead to employment.

Parenting Our Way

The aim of the Parenting Our Way program is to engage First Nations parents/carers who are interested in exploring their parenting journey, through several themed sessions with subject matter experts. The program aims to explore, celebrate parenting skills, enhancing relations and information to support the parenting role, gain skills to build stronger, positive relationships within the family unit.

National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children's Day Message to Community

National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children's Day is dedicated to celebrating our children. The 2022 theme – 'My Dreaming My Future' is fitting in the current climate.

Gugan Gulwan is urging each adult in this community to reflect on this day and commit to ensuring the ongoing cultural connections, safety, wellbeing, and development of our children. There is a clear need for the ACT Government to take a strong stance in ensuring they have **respectful and reciprocal** relationships with the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community of the ACT. Until this happens change will not happen – this is where it all begins. We can continue to read damning reviews and continue to ignore the implementation of recommendations suggested in such reviews – when do we as a community say 'enough'!

Please stand with Gugan Gulwan today and demand action, demand the safety of our children, especially those who are unfortunate enough to be in the out of home care system a system that continually fails our kids – demand that the voices of those who advocate against this broken system are finally heard and listened to.

Every child belongs to a family, families come in different forms. Gugan Gulwan is urging the ACT Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community to stand together as one on this incredibly significant day and ensure each child in this community has access to their dreaming and their future!

Gugan Gulwan worked in collaboration with 3 of the local Koori

preschools within the region to help celebrate this special day and provide the awareness on what is Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children's Day means.

The week began at Richardson Primary School Koori preschool. The children were split up into 3 different groups which allowed for every child to participate in 3 different workshops. The workshops included arts and craft activities, gathering rocks from the garden with each child painting their own rocks and placing them into gardens. The final activity allowed the children to paint a traditional boom box which was then donated to the school.



Gugan Gulwan R U Ok Event - September 2022

To recognise R U OK? Day Gugan Gulwan hosted The Walkabout Barber Brian Dowd and his team. Brian is a qualified Trauma Counsellor who runs a mobile Barber Shop travelling to Communities to provide haircuts and the chance to ask R U Ok? There is also the opportunity to talk about Mental Health. The Walkabout Barber team provided the community and young people with 60 haircuts and 50 beauty treatments.

Brian facilitated two yarning circles exploring Mental Health within the community. The yarning circles gave participants the chance to speak if they wished. Some just listened and were able to relate to the stories being told. Participants found the day a very uplifting way to be free to really ask R U Ok? It also provided them with ideas and skills to use if the answer was, I'm not ok.




